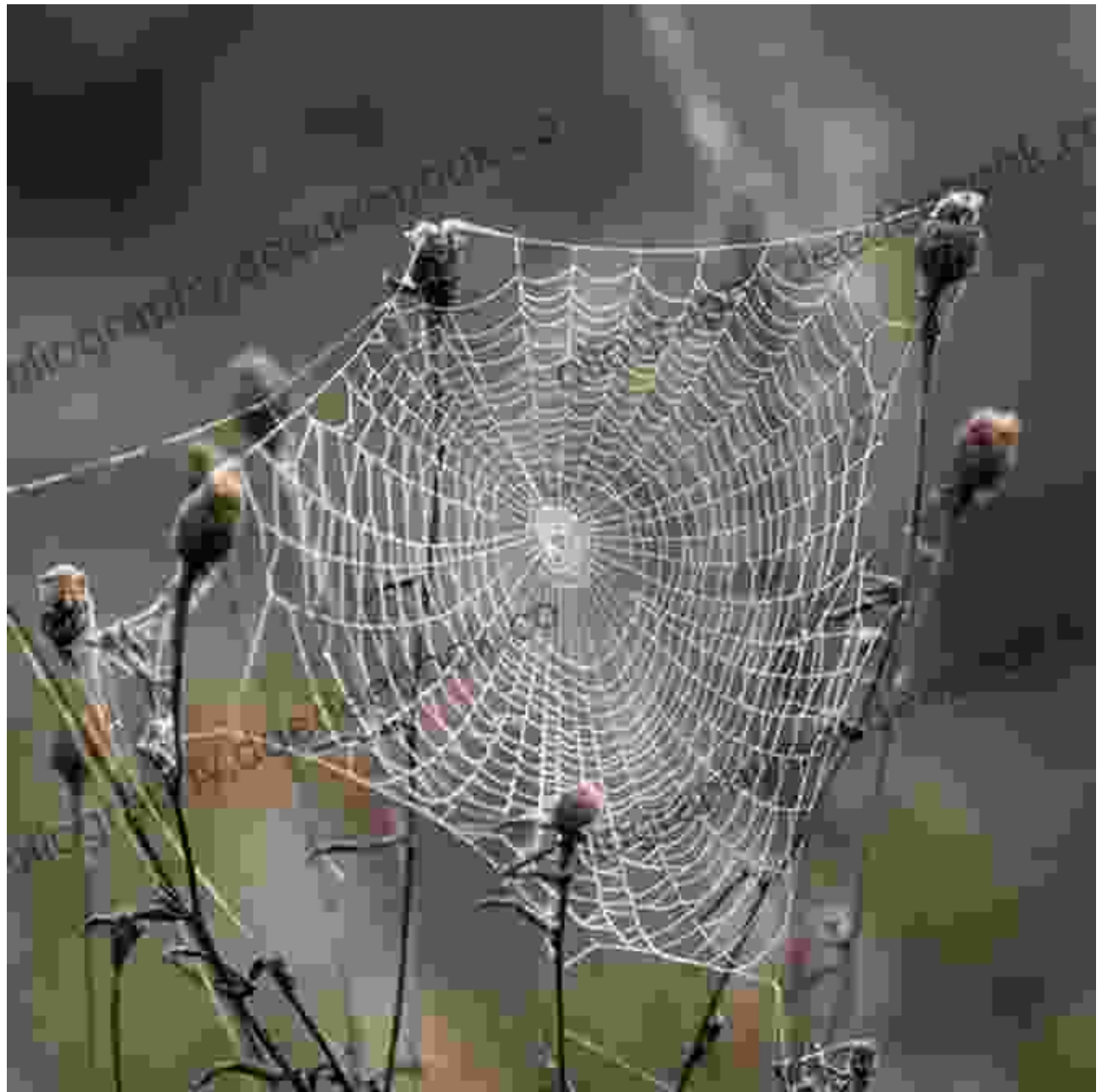

wonder in sight.

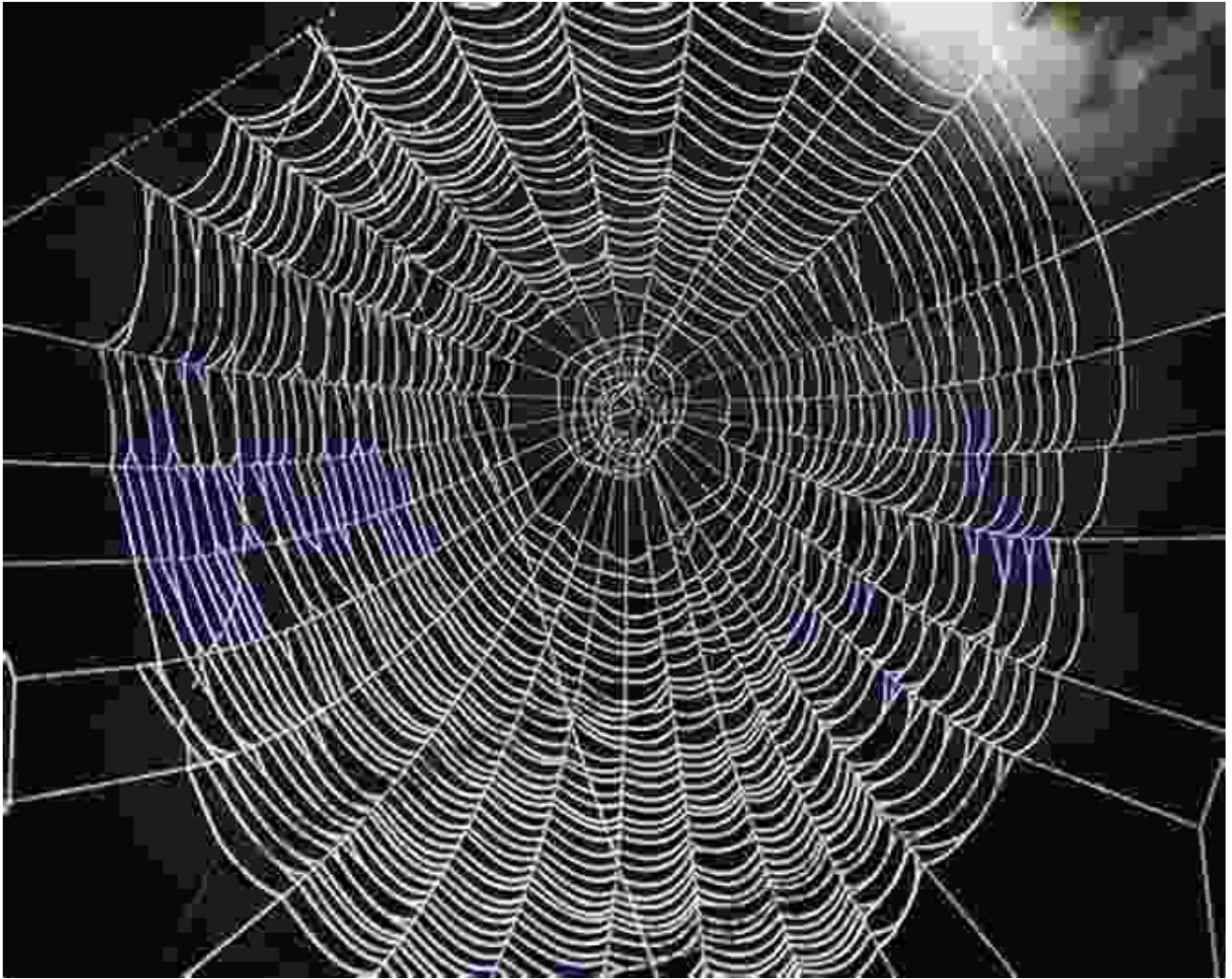
Verse 5: The Tarantula

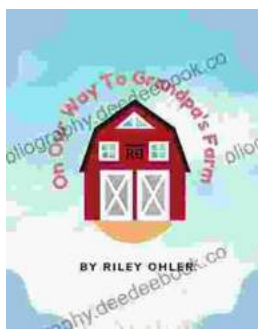

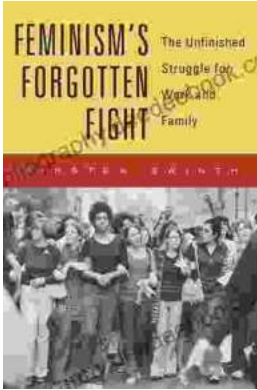
