Players then take turns playing cards to the table, forming combinations. The first player to play a card to the table is called the cribber. The cribber also gets to cut the deck and take the top six cards of the stock to form the crib.

Once all the cards have been played, the players count their points. The player with the highest score wins the round.

- Winning: The first player to reach 121 points wins the game.


