note. This gives it a dark and mysterious sound.

3. The Lydian Augmented Scale (Middle Eastern)

The Lydian Augmented scale is 3rd mode of Melodic Minor and is composed of the following intervals: 1, 2, 3, #4, #5, 6, 7.
The boxes below show you the scale over the whole neck as a 3 octave scale and as the 7 three note per string positions that link together to let you play it anywhere on the fretboard

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The Lydian augmented scale is an octatonic scale that is used in Middle Eastern music. It is similar to the Lydian scale, but with a raised 5th and 7th note. This gives it a bright and shimmering sound.

4. The Spanish Phrygian Scale (Spanish)



The Spanish Phrygian scale is a heptatonic scale that is used in Spanish flamenco music. It is similar to the Phrygian scale, but with a raised 3rd note. This gives it a passionate and fiery sound.

5. The Chinese Pentatonic Scale (Chinese)

The Chinese pentatonic scale is a pentatonic scale that is used in Chinese traditional music. It is similar to the minor pentatonic scale, but with a raised 2nd note. This gives it a haunting and ethereal sound.

6. The Hungarian Minor Scale (Hungarian)


The HUNGARIAN MINOR SCALE or the DOUBLE HARMONIC MINOR SCALE or the GYPSY MINOR SCALE to give it a few names is composed of the following intervals: 1,2,b3,+4,5,b6,7.

The boxes below show you the scale over the whole neck, as a 3 octave scale and as the 7 three note per string positions that link together to let you play it anywhere on the fretboard.

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The Hungarian minor scale is a heptatonic scale that is used in Hungarian folk music. It is similar to the natural minor scale, but with a raised 4th and 7th note. This gives it a dark and brooding sound.

The Bhairav scale is a heptatonic scale that is used in Indian classical music. It is similar to the major scale, but with a lowered 2nd and 6th note. This gives it a majestic and uplifting sound.

The Mixolydian b6 scale is a heptatonic scale that is used in jazz music. It is similar to the Mixolydian scale, but with a lowered 6th note. This gives it a bluesy and soulful sound.


10. The Double Harmonic Scale (Western)


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
DOUBLE HARMONIC- Position 4




DOUBLE HARMONIC- Position 5

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
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
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
