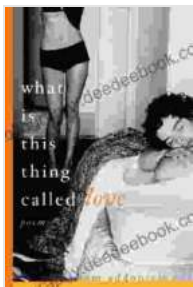

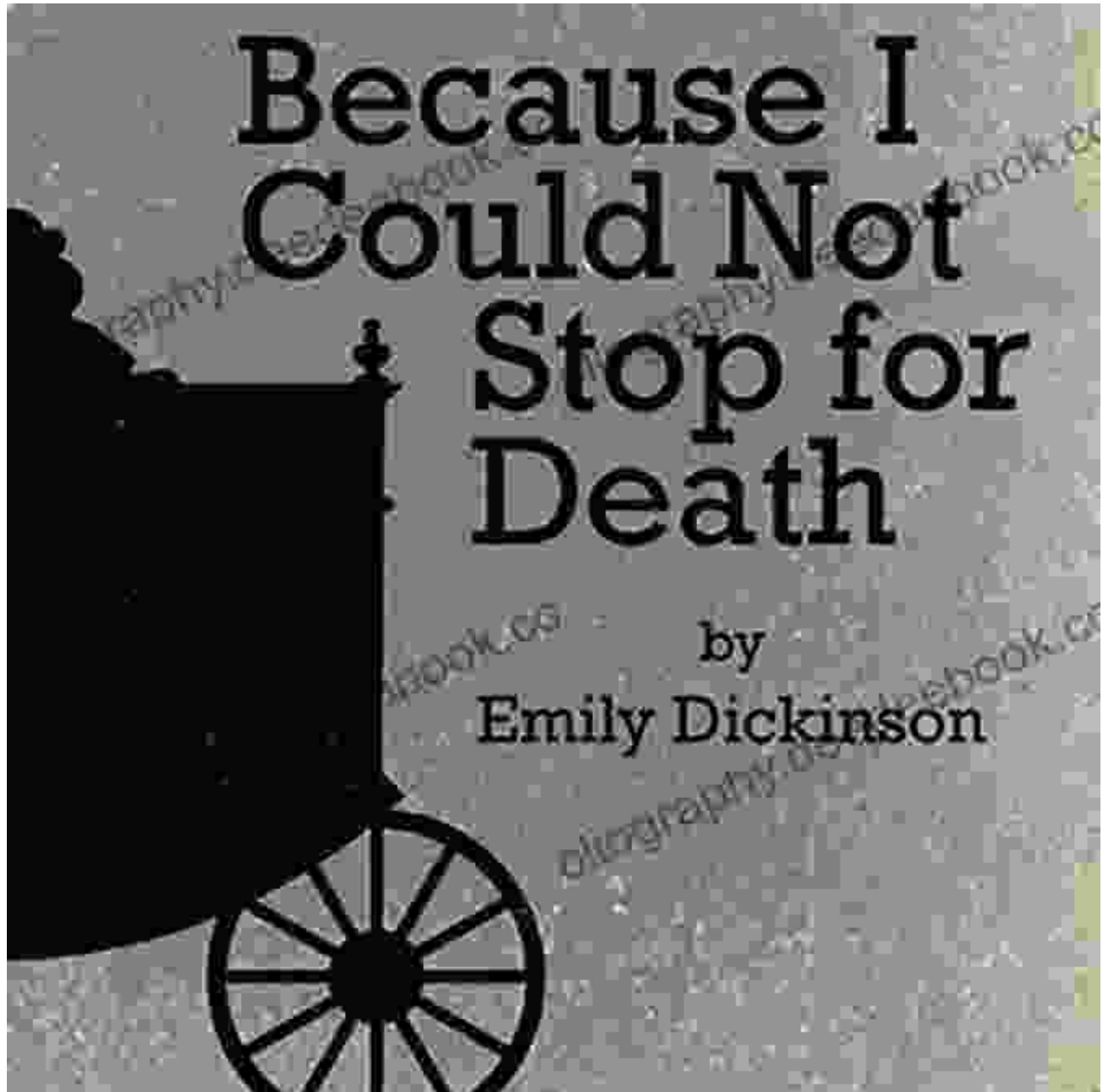


The Agony of Unrequited Love

Once upon a midnight dreary, while I pondered, weak and weary, Over many

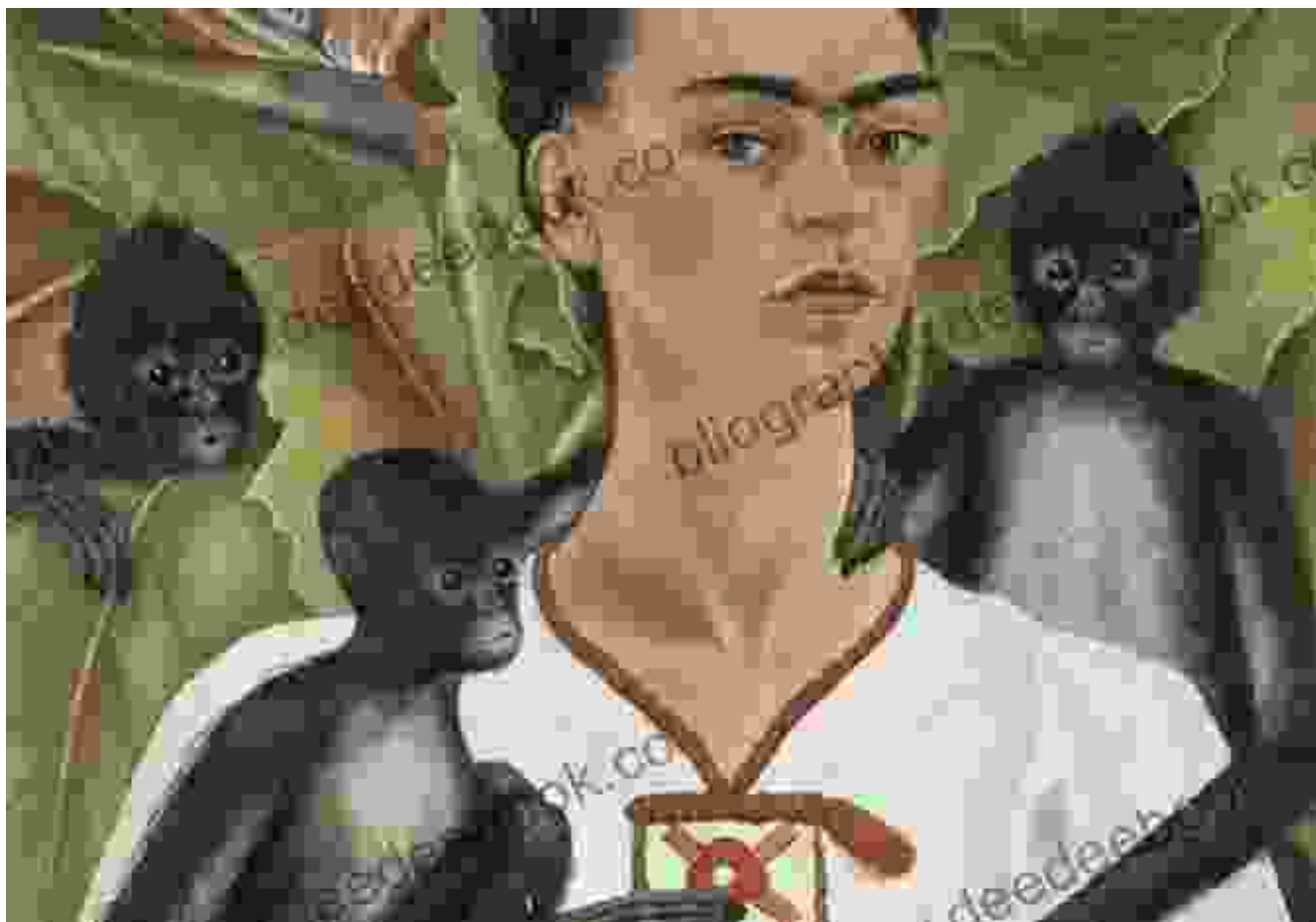


The Enduring Legacy of Love

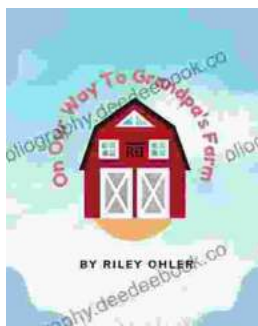

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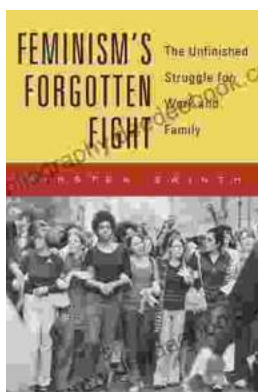
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
